**SYNEX INTERNATIONAL INC.
UPDATE FOR EX-DIVIDEND DATE AND PROJECT DEVELOPMENT ACTIVITIES**

Synex International Inc. (the “Company”) announces that the ex-dividend date for the annual dividend previously announced May 15, 2015 has been revised to the close of business on June 9, 2015. The dividend in the amount of one-cent (\$0.01) per share will be payable on or about June 26, 2015 to shareholders of record at the close of business on June 12, 2015. The ex-dividend date shall be the close of business on June 9, 2015.

Synex Energy Resources Ltd. (“Synex Energy”), a wholly owned subsidiary of the Company, has terminated the non-binding term sheet with respect to potential partnering with an independent third party on the proposed 4.4MW Newcastle Creek Hydro Project and the proposed 5.3MW McKelive Creek Hydro Project, previously announced on April 13, 2015. Synex Energy is continuing to advance discussions regarding partnering on the projects with the independent third party and others.

Synex International Inc. is an experienced run of river hydroelectric developer and consultant located in Vancouver, British Columbia. The Company wholly owns or has interests in 12 MW of operating facilities and has applications for water licences and land tenure on over 55 potential hydroelectric sites which are either in various stages of development or are being held for disposition.
